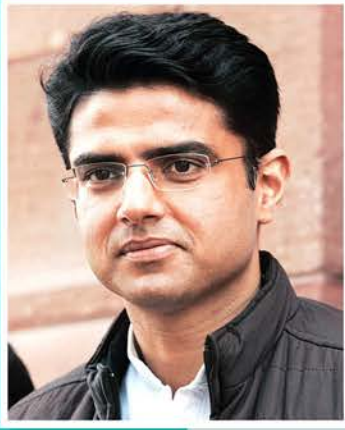

It doesn't matter what you do, he said, so long as you change something from the way it was before you touched it into something that's like you after you take your hands away. LEGACY. What a beautiful thing! To create something gorgeous and meaningful that outlives your days. Typically, we as humans, do not necessarily think about legacy until much later in life. Young people often do not think of their lives in terms of impact and often see themselves as invincible. Thinking about a personal legacy isn't something included in class sessions or lessons recorded in books. More than ever before, it is an opportune time to steer young people towards thinking about their legacy and how they would like to be known and remembered. It is time for us as educators and parents to reinforce to our kids that their actions even during childhood contribute to their final legacy and impact. That it is futile to get distracted by trivial or meaningless pursuits. Thinking about legacy by making a difference is an invaluable lesson in character building and life skills and even our youngest kids need to be aware of how their actions will lead to inconceivable outcomes and how we live our lives is so critically important. The questions we need to constantly ask our kids are:

How will you define your values, your worth, and global role so that you may leave this world better

than you found it?

Does the value of your life go beyond you?

How or why would you like to be remembered by your future generations?

What are the things you feel strongly about and how would you like to change them?

How will you make your life matter?

What message do you want to send with your life to the world and to the people who matter the most to you?

We are all connected by the legacies passed down from those who came before us and the legacies we pass down to those who come after us. For both the young and the old alike, the thought of legacy enables us to lead our lives more meaningfully and mindfully. We understand that we are all part of a larger community, a community that must remember its history to build its future. That is caring combined with conscience. Through legacy, "me" becomes "we". "We" encompasses the past and the future, the old and the young, and the society we create and perpetuate.

Ask yourself where is it best to plant a young sapling. In a clearing in a thick forest or in an open, vast field? Research has it that a young tree grows better when it is planted closer to old trees. The reason, it seems, is that the roots of the young tree follow the pathways created by the older trees and hence, implant themselves more deeply and securely. Over a period of time, the roots of many trees graft themselves to each other, creating an intricate, interdependent foundation deep in the ground. In this way, older and stronger trees support the weaker and newer ones so that the whole forest thrives. That, I believe, is Legacy! An interconnectedness across time, with a need for those who came before us and a responsibility towards those who would come after us.

Most of us will not be a Gandhi or a Nelson Mandela or a Mother Teresa, with our accomplishments indelibly recorded in the annals of History. But that does not lessen the need to create meaning in our lives, to have what we have done live on after us and to be remembered in a good way, or in some way. Creating a legacy plan allows us to be more intentional and purposeful in proactively creating the life we want for us and our kids. Not only will this propel one towards happiness but also serve as an example and set our children up to achieve their greatest success. Creating a culture of purpose and intentionality in homes and schools is the beginning of legacy succession. Regardless of the curriculum our kids are exposed to, they will emerge from childhood with clear views on what their elders value, and with a well developed value system of their own. It boils down on us to teach them to set high standards for themselves and to never apologise for striving to live up to these high values, making them absolutely non-negotiable.

Each one of us has the remarkable ability to positively impact the world and touch lives far into the future. I urge parents, educators, homes, schools and communities to start thinking about Legacy creation and instill the same in the children. After all, when we are no longer around, the world will belong to these children and later, to theirs. If you have started thinking about it already, Bravo! The value of our lives goes beyond us. And is carried forth to and from our children. We can make the world better, one person at a time. After all, greatness comes from beginning something that does not end with you. It's time to live your life more deliberately.

Start building your legacy NOW. Tomorrow will be too late.

Wake up Call

To educate a man in mind and not in morals is to educate a menace to society.

-Theodore Roosevelt

Education is only complete when it leads to all round development of the individual, which encompasses not only mental but also moral development. Moral education influences the social thinking of the individual and makes him/her distinguish between what is right and what is wrong. Moral education is a basic need for modern times where one is fast witnessing a degeneration of moral values. Moral education is important as it teaches diversity, tolerance, mutual respect and pluralistic values.

Moral values are values that express ideas about good life. As such, concern for the moral virtues, such as honesty, responsibility, and respect for others, is the domain of moral education.

Since young people readily and unconsciously assimilate all types of influences, good or bad, if they do not have proper guidance, it is important that society provides them with a type of education that will make them acquire sound religious and moral principles, and also develop appropriate attitudes and values that will help them to make good choices and decisions in their adulthood.

Moral education, then, refers to helping children acquire those virtues or moral habits that will help them individually live good lives and at the same time become productive, contributing members of their communities.

In this view, moral education should contribute not only to the students as individuals, but also to the social cohesion of a community. A moral education system must begin by defining the morals which are most important for not only the individual but for the society as a whole.

The system must be designed as such that the individual at a formative stage should distinguish to differentiate between what is good and what is bad. Here practical learning should take precedence over bookish learning. The environment in which people live has always influenced patterns of behavior, attitudes, actions, beliefs, values and ethics.

There is need for schools to encourage the youth to understand why people do one thing and not another. They should be able to make choices in order to become ethically mature adults. They should be assisted to learn how to take a position and consider facts relevant about a moral issue.

The study of morality is vital because we live in a world of rapid change where there are various cultures coming into conflict, in which people are not guided by a single code of ethics but by many different values and rules. The differences are often not easily reconciled; and, in fact, may be irreconcilable. It is important to understand the nature of these differences, as most discussions and debates about morals address them.

The socio-cultural changes like transition from joint family to nuclear family system, excessive competition, parental expectations, commercialization of education, negative impact of media, misuse of information technology, globalization, consumerism etc. are putting immense pressure on children, families and schools leading to distortion of values.

The present scenario needs to undergo a radical change as the country's future depends on its children.

Swami Vivekananda said of Education: "Education is the manifestation of perfection already in man..."

Exercising Restraint a Challenge

Restraint has become a dirty word in modern culture. All of our cultural messages incite us to push and push harder! Get in now! Make it happen. Only rarely do we hear a quiet voice that encourages us to consider the impact of what we say and do.

Everything we say and do has an impact on someone or some thing. When we act or speak from our reactions, the impact of this is rarely constructive. However, when we wait until we are neutral and calm, and focused on our intention to make choices that are essence-rich, what we say and do has a result that is constructive, satisfying and fulfilling.

Exercising restraint is really based in understanding which investments of our energy are in our long-term best interest and supportive of the well-being of everyone involved.

The conventional wisdom in many circles is that expressing our emotions is healthy. From what I can tell, this has been used wholeheartedly as a justification for some of the most destructive sharing we do, like "sticking up for ourselves" by letting someone have it; or by dumping our toxic emotional reactions onto others; or blurting out passive-aggressive remarks in retaliation. The impact of this kind of sharing is destructive. Less obvious might be impulsively agreeing to do something because you're excited about the opportunity.

Giving advice is another tricky one. I'd Pause for a moment and think about how it feels to be given advice you didn't ask for and don't really want. You feel alienated, right? Now, ask yourself how often you've given unsolicited advice or have gone on and on when you knew you weren't really invited to share all of that. You felt that you were helping, but the impact wasn't honestly helpful because the recipient of your advice was shutting down, trying to wriggle away or wanting to fight about it.

Saying and doing are big investments of energy, and they have an inevitable, if often unpredictable, result. While we never honestly know the full ramifications of a lot of the choices we make, without some sort of self-regulation, the consequences usually aren't good.

Even when we use essence as a basis for our choices, there is no guarantee that essence will result. If we fail to embrace uncertainty and don't honor the timing, for example, we can push to make something happen rather than waiting for the appropriate time. Without exercising restraint, we won't be able to pay attention and notice that we're pushing and getting frustrated as a result. [Our greatest Achilles heel is, of course, the emotional wave, especially when we don't wait to be neutral before speaking or taking action.]

Our challenge today is to exercise restraint, of course. I'd like you to pause and take your emotional pulse before you say or do something. Do you know what essence you intend to result? Is the timing correct? Are you neutral and objective? If not, try waiting until your mind is quiet and your heart, full of your desire for fulfillment.

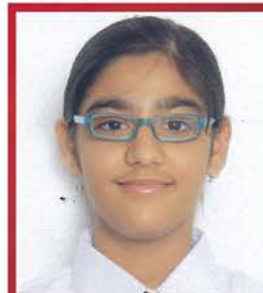

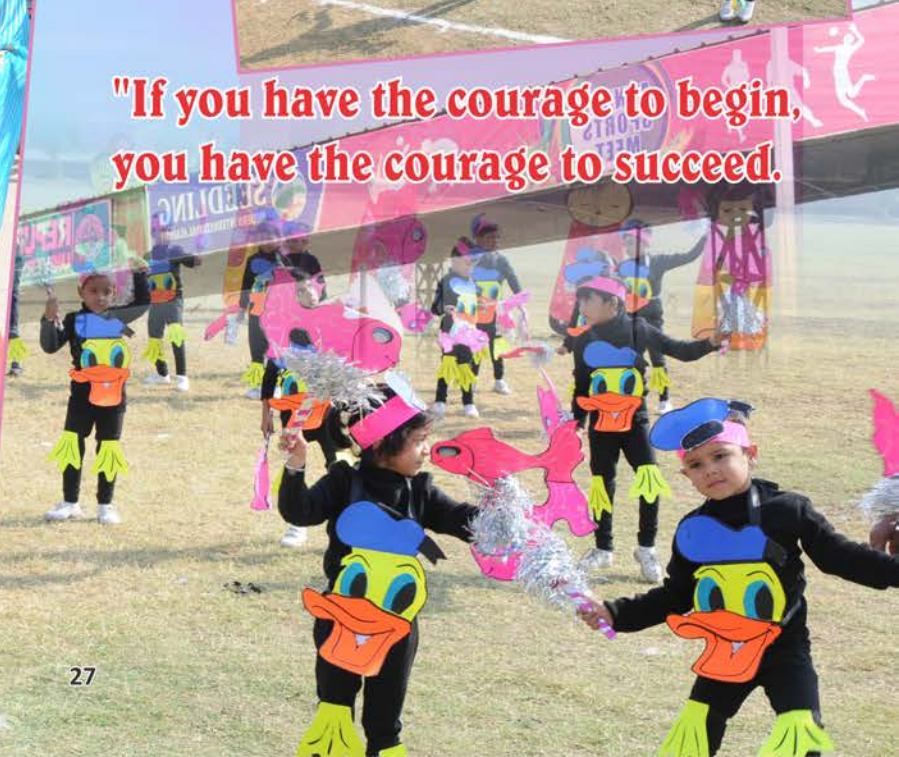

Jaipur National University Confers Honoris Causa upon SGI President Daisaku Ikeda



On November 21, 2019, Jaipur National University (JNU) in India conferred the degree of Doctor of Philosophy, honoris causa, upon Soka University founder and SGI President Daisaku Ikeda, honoring his contribution as a peace builder, Buddhist philosopher, writer and educator. Mr. Ikeda is the first person to be conferred with an honorary doctorate by the university. The ceremony, held at the Dr. Ambedkar International Centre in New Delhi, was attended by Dr. Preeti Bakshi, Executive Director of JNU, JNU Vice Chancellor H.N. Verma, and Bharat Soka Gakkai (BSG) Chairperson Vishesh Gupta and Soka Gakkai Senior Vice President Hiromasa Ikeda.

Soka Gakkai International is a Buddhist organization, based on the philosophy of Nichiren's teachings, committed to deep transformation in the depths of its members' life, bringing about ripples of change in their immediate environment and society at large.

Hiromasa Ikeda, Senior Vice President, Soka Gakkai International and the son of Daisaku Ikeda graced the occasion with his presence and received the honour on behalf of the President.

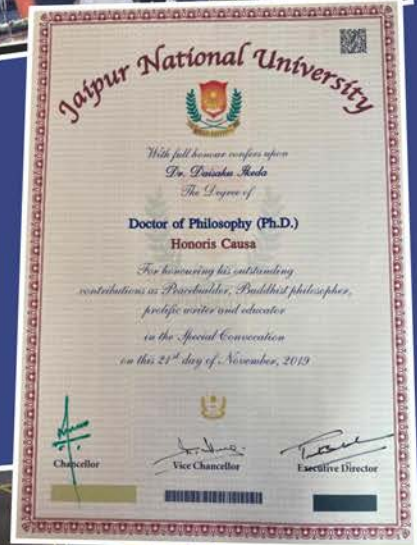
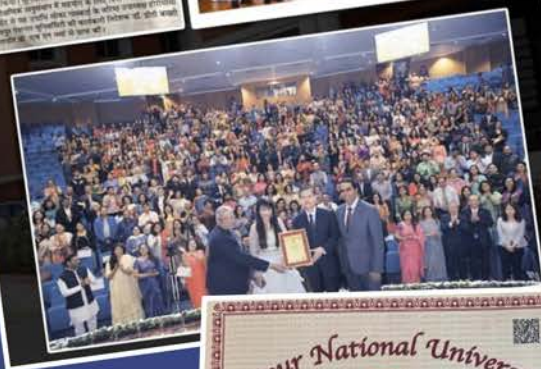

The program was concluded by Vote of Thanks by the Vice Chancellor of Jaipur National University Prof. H.N. Verma.



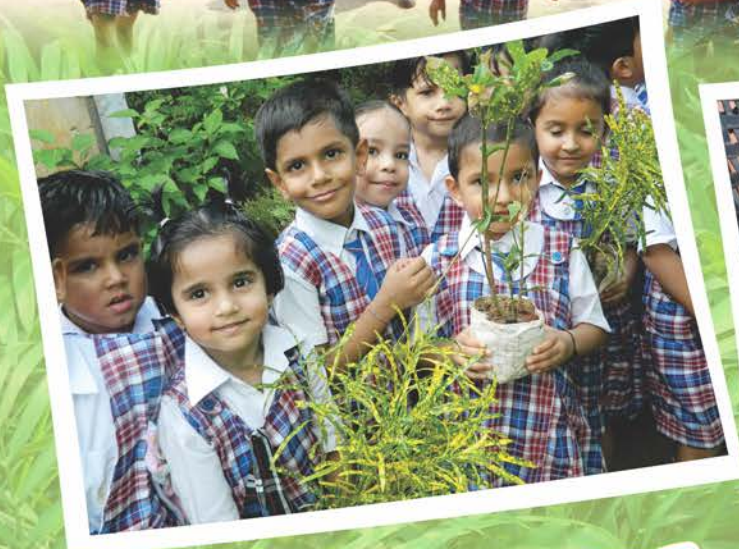

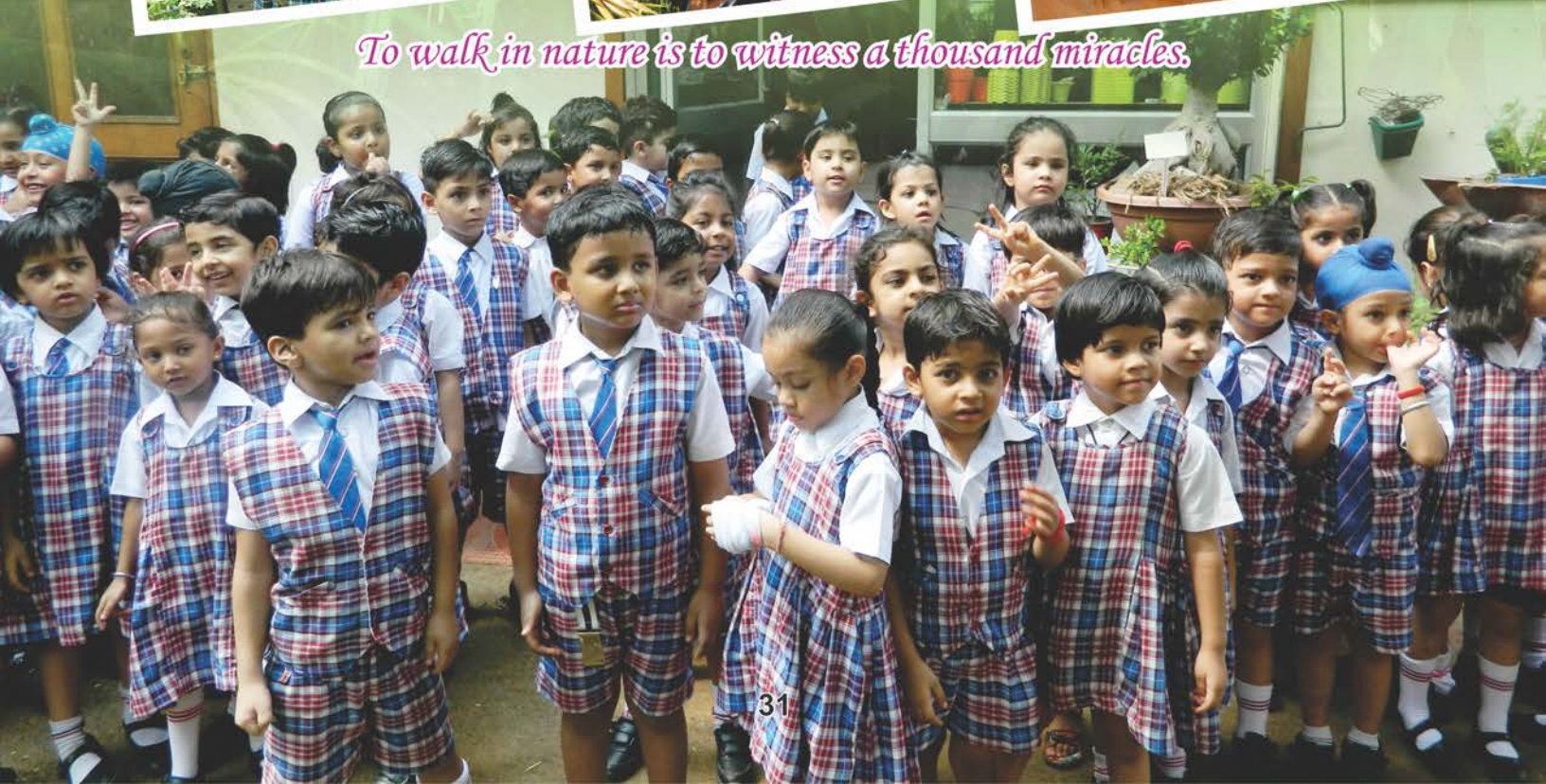

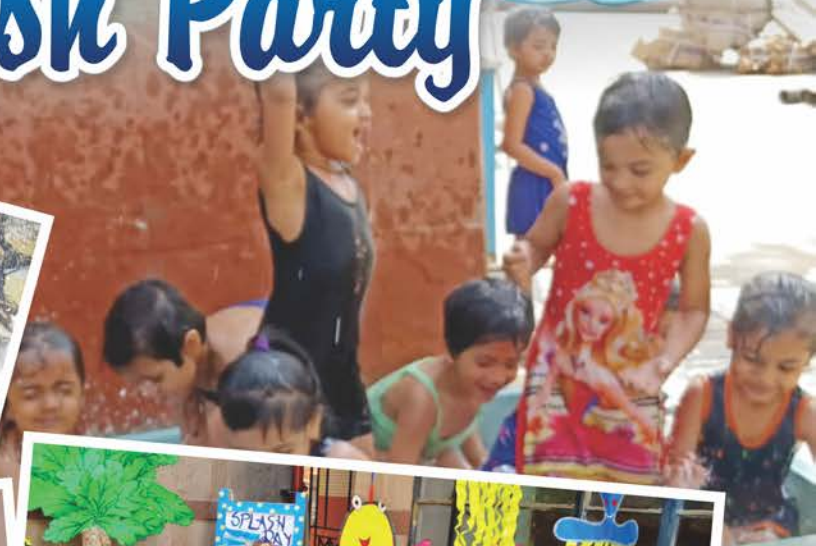

Natural vegetation and wildlife is our wealth. Today there is a crucial need to conserve wildlife and natural vegetation. Both plants and animals together maintain the ecosystem which is important for our survival. If the number of any of the species decreases it will affect the ecosystem in an adverse manner. Both wildlife and natural vegetation is under threat due to natural and human activities. Many species have become endangered like asiatic lion, blue whale, great Indian bustard, etc and some are on the verge of extinction like golden cat, mink seal, poring pied hornbill, etc. Due to depreciation, increasing population, industrialization, constructional activities, forest fires, tsunami and landslide the habitats of various species are destroyed and the process of extinction of these great and precious natural resources is accelerated. Poaching, i.e. illegal hunting, fishing, eating or trapping wild animals is another factor that is responsible for extinction of many animals. Animals are poached for collection and illegal trade of hides, skins, nails, teeth, horns as well as feathers, some of these animals are tiger, lion, elephant, deer, crocodile, rhinosoros snow leopard, ostrich and peacock. There is a balance in the environment only when the relative number of species is not disturbed. Not only animals but some plants have also become extinct like Sarpagandha and Brahmakas. Human activities in several parts of the world have disturbed the natural habitats of many species. Due to indiscriminate killings, several animals and birds have either become extinct or are on the verge of extinction. So it is our duty to save these birds and animals. Measures that should be taken to conserve wildlife:

1. Awareness programmes like social forestry, Joint Forest Management and Vanmahotsava should be expurgated at the regional and community level.
2. Strict laws to check poaching should be formulated.
3. Deforestation should be strictly prohibited.
4. Special protected areas should be developed to protect all types of wildlife.
5. Plants and animals should be allowed to live freely in their natural habitats.

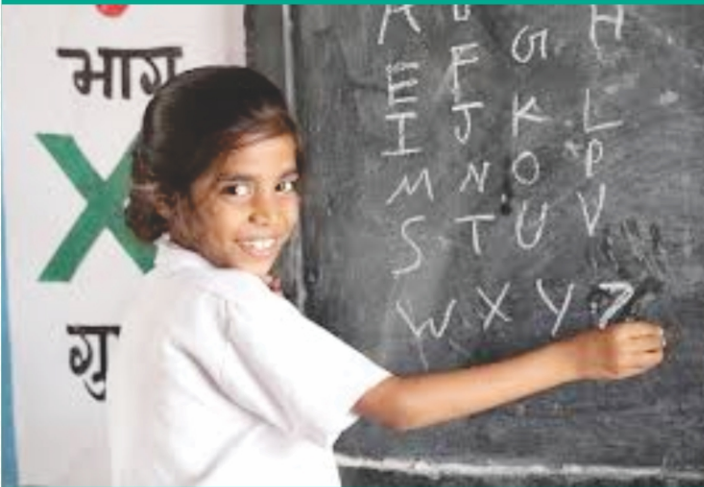

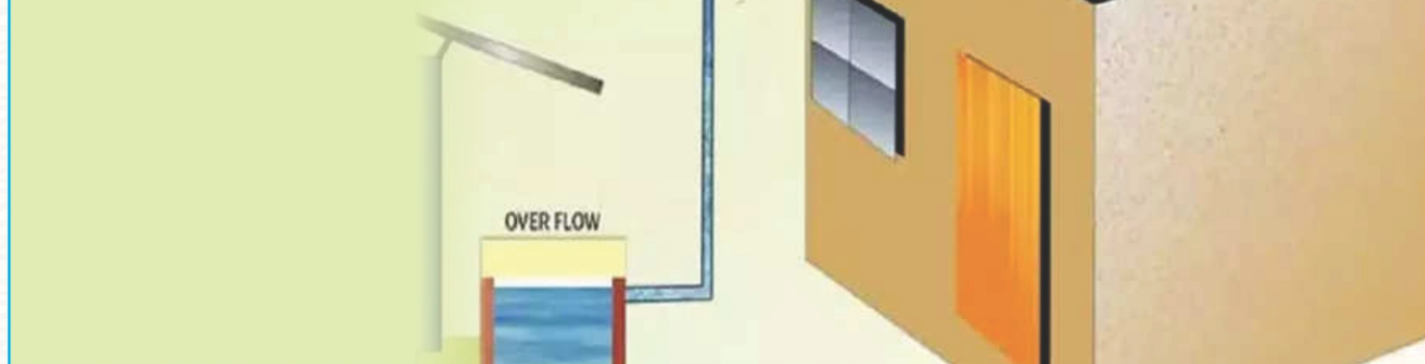

Rain Water Harvesting



Rain water harvesting is the collection and storage of rain water in artificially designed resources to prevent water runoff and fulfil the need of water in future. The quantity of water harvesting is affected by the number of factors like frequency of rainfall, quantity of rainfall, way of collection of rain water and size of resources to collect water. The ground water level is getting depleted day by day due to various reasons like deforestation, ecological imbalance, increasing level of urbanization and industrialization. It constantly increases the demand of water supply specially in the urban areas. It results in the overuse of groundwater and thus going low. The risk of water scarcity in the future has been increased to a great extent and can be life threatening if some effective solutions are not followed.

Water harvesting is very helpful in fulfilling various needs like recharging the ground water level, reducing electricity bill spent in supplying water and providing easy water supply at anytime when required. It is estimated that one meter rise in the water level saves around 04 KWH of electricity.

Rain water harvesting is very necessary to be practised by the people in all regions. It is good to reduce the fear of water scarcity in the future. Rain water harvesting is necessary as:

- Surface water cannot fulfil the demand of water for various purposes.
- Everyone depends on the ground water for their daily need.
- Deforestation, rapid urbanization, rain water infiltration to the sub - soil etc. reasons are continuously decreasing the level of ground water.
- Rainwater conservation maintains the level of water in natural water resources and reduces the chance of flooding of water on the roads, reduces the risk of soil erosion and improves the quality of water.
- Rainwater harvesting can be done either by collecting rainwater to the surface for future use or by recharging the ground water.

La tour Eiffel

est une tour de fer puddlé de 324 mètres de hauteur située à Paris à l'extrémité nord-ouest du parc du Champ-de-Mars en bordure de la Seine dans le 7^e arrondissement. Son adresse officielle est 5, avenue Anatole-France². Construite par Gustave Eiffel et ses collaborateurs pour l'Exposition universelle de Paris de 1889, et initialement nommée «tour de 300 mètres», ce monument est devenu le symbole de la capitale française, et un site touristique de premier plan : il s'agit du troisième site culturel français payant le plus visité en 2015, avec 6,9 millions de visiteurs³.

D'une hauteur de 312 mètres à l'origine, la tour Eiffel est restée le monument le plus élevé du monde pendant quarante ans. Le second niveau du troisième étage, appelé parfois quatrième étage, situé à 279,11 mètres, est la plus haute plateforme d'observation accessible au public de l'Union européenne et la deuxième plus haute d'Europe, derrière la tour.

Ostankino à Moscou culminant à 337 mètres. La hauteur de la tour a été plusieurs fois augmentée par l'installation de nombreuses antennes. Utilisée dans le passé pour de nombreuses expériences scientifiques, elle sert aujourd'hui d'émetteur de programmes radiophoniques et télévisés.
